

## Athletic Booster FAQs

### **1) What is an extra benefit?**

Any special arrangement by a Representative of Athletics Interests to provide a student-athlete (current or prospective), their relatives or friends a benefit that is not generally available to other Brevard College students.

### **2) Will what I do as a booster, really affect BC student athletes??**

YES. Any provision of an EXTRA BENEFIT to a prospective or currently enrolled student-athlete by an institutional staff member or athletics representative jeopardizes the athletics eligibility of that student-athlete. We urge you not to provide a prospective or enrolled student-athlete with any benefit without contacting the Compliance Office to determine the permissibility of your actions.

### **3) Can a Representative of Athletics Interests meet with a prospective student-athlete?**

A Representative of Athletics Interests cannot meet with a prospective student-athlete off of Brevard College's campus. However a Representative of Athletics Interests can meet with a prospective student-athlete on Brevard College's campus.

### **4) Can a Representative of Athletics Interests provide a gift or treat a prospective student-athlete to a free meal?**

No. It is not permissible to give a prospective student-athlete a gift or treat him/her to a free meal. Once the prospect becomes a current student-athlete it would be permissible to invite the current student-athlete over for an occasional meal at the individual's home.

**5) Is Brevard College responsible for the actions of its representatives of athletics interests?**

Yes! Brevard College is subject to penalties for all violations of NCAA rules committed by its representatives of athletics interests.
